A StoryWalk® is an innovative and delightful way for children and adults to enjoy reading and the outdoors at the same time.

Pages from a children's book are attached to stakes, which are placed along an outdoor path. Along with their family, caregiver or educator; children will follow the path where they will encounter the book page-by-page. The stories are often linked to the season or surroundings.

Supporting Communities

Books:

We chose several books to be used for StoryWalks®. These stories are available to loan from our EarlyON centres upon request. Requests can be made to your local EarlyON centre.

You may wish to choose your own story and utilize our story boards. To prepare your own story book you would need two copies of the book. The pages are cut with a knife and then laminated.

Story Boards:

The story book can be attached to the story boards using the provided velcro fasteners. The story boards are placed outside along a path or trail, throughout a school yard or beach.

Enhancing the Story:

Activities can be done along the way to enhance the experience. Educators or caregivers can ask thoughtful questions about the story during the walk.
